

Town Council Minutes 39 W. Main Street

November 9, 2017 - 7:00 p.m.

Empire Landscaping has trimmed around the cabinet at the West end of town. The eye was facing backwards into the woods which was keeping the streetlights on all the time. That has been fixed and turned around so now with the trimming of the trees and some landscaping, it's opened up the area around the cabinet to allow the lights to come on and off at the appropriate times. There are some drainage issues still to be addressed. There are inventory items available for the businesses in town for "Shop Local" that can be picked up to display for November 25, 2017 Shop Local day.
