Event Barn

Mayor Burhans provided via email the latest Architectural and MEP drawings for the Event Barn and requested comments back. This matter continued from the meeting of October 20, 2022, because no one had a chance to review the drawings. Councilman Weatherly discussed the option of solar panels on the roof and in the parking lot. Councilman Weatherly to research and provide answers back to the mayor. The Progress Set of Drawings are about 80 percent complete. Councilman Rossman discussed dedicating the Event Barn to Kathleen Snowden.

Traffic Calming

Mayor Burhans and Town Engineer Burnett discussed the October 31, 2022, email from Dave Olney, Engineering Supervisor, Frederick County Government, regarding the intersection of Old New Market Road and East Wainscot Drive. Mr. Burnett presented the design of the pedestrian refuge island. The concept of improving the crosswalk was discussed. Mr. Burnett is to prepare a response outlining the following comments before the Town can consider an endorsement of the proposed crosswalk improvement:

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- 1. Provide details on the proposed signage for the island.
- 2. Explain if pedestrian push buttons to initiate solar-powered flashing warning lights for motorists can be installed.
- 3. Explain if the posted speed limit can be reduced along Old New Market Road approaching this crosswalk.
- 4. Explain if the height of the island can be increased to provide more protection for crosswalk users.
- 5. Explain if the anticipated increase in crosswalk users once school bus service is terminated to the adjacent communities has been accounted for in identifying features of a solution.
- 6. Explain if street lighting can improve nighttime crosswalk users' safety.

NEW BUSINESS

Zoning Text Amendment to Permit Inns a Land Use in the RM Zone

Ms. Faux reported that the Town received a Use Permit application for an Inn at 5 West Main Street to be run remotely via an online booking service. This property, known as the National Hotel, functioned as an Inn on Main Street for many years. Upon review of the Land Development Ordinance, staff has determined that while Inns were once an everyday use Downtown, the current zoning does not permit this use unless the structure is also residential and functions as a "manager or operator-occupied dwelling." Without a resident onsite, the requested user does not qualify as a B&B Residential particular use. For this use to be approved, a zoning text amendment is required to add an Inn as a similarly scaled Non-Residential Use. Ms. Faux presented a draft Ordinance that would add a new permitted use in the Residential Merchant Zone for an Inn by adding it to Article IV District Regulations Section 1.5 as a Non-Residential Use #1.5.7 stated that Public Hearing is required to proceed with the change.
